

PART 3. THE NEW YORK TIMES for additional items that relate to this part of the bibliography (which are not repeated in this part)

• Clarence E. Dutton's "Tertiary History of the Grand Cañon District" (U.S. Geological Survey Monograph 2, 1881, 1885), with its great double-folio *Atlas* comprising 23 geologic maps and geologically significant scenic views by William Henry Holmes and Thomas Moran, is one of the most-sought publications by afficionados of the American West—with prices attending to the demand. Many copies of the Atlas have been disbound over the years and its plates reused or made available separately.

Part 28 includes citations of items that contain potentially offensive material, with sexual or other matter that some users, for religious, moral, or personal reasons, may not wish to encounter. The pertinent citations are grouped in the <u>Supplement</u> at the end of Part 28. It is additionally important to segregate these citations as this is an internationally focused bibliography with an international audience, whose particular perspectives may not be known to this compiler. The cited items themselves may contain explicit material but a few of them do not; yet these, too, are segregated because the serials in which they appear do contain such matter.

ART OF THE GRAND CANYON

Art of the Grand Canyon: An Introduction and Annotated Bibliography. (2023)

The Introduction is a very brief, admitedly arbitrary, primer of Grand Canyon art for readers who may not be very familiar with the subject, highlighting some usual and some appealingly unusual aspects about well-known and obscure artists alike, and a few of their pieces. It also finds some new perspectives and makes a few comparisons that might be thought-provoking, perhaps unrealized. The annotated bibliography gathers citations for publications, beginning in 1853, that in some way mention or illustrate the work of Grand Canyon artists between 1851 and 2023. It serves as a documentary effort that confirms the breadth and depth of artistic interest in the Grand Canyon. It also introduces numerous artists who have not had the privilege of being "recognized" in the world of art, such as those whose work was contributed "on the fly" to various journals and magazines, who are not acclaimed artists in their own right.
